

Human Factors in Home Peritoneal Dialysis (PD): Barriers and Facilitators to Infection Prevention

Human factors experts want to make dialysis safer by making infection prevention easier.

Scientists from Virginia Tech are partnering with the American Society of Nephrology and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to learn how people do their PD at home.

The team wants to know:

- What makes it hard to prevent infections?
- What do you do to prevent infections?

If you agree to participate in the project:

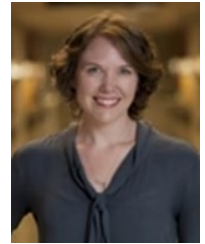
The team will visit you in your home one day for about 3-hours. The team will ask to watch as you prepare for treatment. They will also ask to watch as you do exit site care.

The team will not look at your health record. If the information is shared in the future, anything that could identify you will be removed. If you feel uncomfortable at all, you can ask to leave the project.

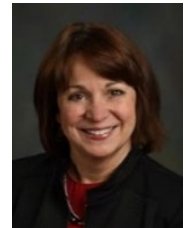

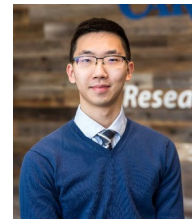
